The United Nations High Commission for Refugees is charged with protecting refugees, and solving refugee problems around the world. They focus on rights protection.

The Migration Policy Institute is an independent organization which studies the movement of people worldwide. The site contains research on subject areas including the brain drain, immigrants and integration, refugees, internally displaced people, and international humanitarian response.

The Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre was established by the Norwegian Refugee Council, and considers itself “the leading international body monitoring conflict-induced internal displacement worldwide.” They aim to improve capacity for protection of internally displaced people.

Forced Migration Online provides comprehensive access to an interdisciplinary range of information sources on forced migration. The website has a wide range of resources and research guides, which pull together the key resources available on subjects such as human trafficking, gender and forced migration, Roma, and urban refugees.
